



SELF-TEST REPORTING TO NHS

It is a requirement for all individuals who perform a COVID-19 self-test to report the result to the National Health Services.

The following guidelines have been published by NHS:

What is a Rapid Lateral Flow Self-Test?

A rapid lateral flow test is a coronavirus test you do yourself. It shows you the result on a handheld device that comes with the test.

Reporting the result

- Every time you use a rapid lateral flow test kit
- As soon as possible after you get the result
- You cannot report a result after more than 24 hours.
- You can only report one result at a time.

Why should you report your results?

Reporting results helps to:

- reduce infection rates in your community
- protect people at higher risk of infection
- prevent and reduce the spread of the virus
- find out if you are infectious (you may not have symptoms)

How to Report my result

Before you begin, please ensure you have:

- The QR code or ID number printed on the test strip (the part of the kit that shows your result)
- A mobile phone number so we can text you to confirm that we have got your result
